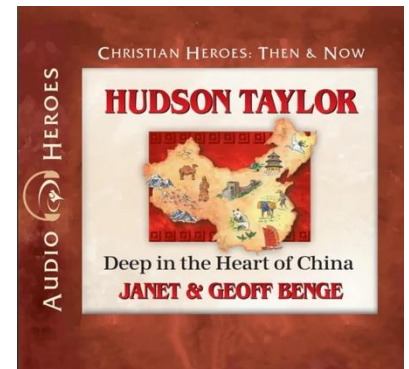

The time flew by as we listened with rapped attention to the faith and sacrifice of Dietrich Bonhoffer, C.S. Lewis, George Muller, Nate Saint, Hudson Taylor and John Wesley. Normally, we wouldn't take the time to just sit and listen to audio books, but we eagerly looked forward to these inspiring and challenging stories. It has turned a cancer journey into an uplifting spiritual encouragement. This is just one more experience that is “working out for our good.”



Youthful Smile

While leaving the radiation center, we met Jace, a 12-year-old boy, who just finished three months of radiation for brain cancer. I enthusiastically congratulated him and he flashed a big smile. His

mom told us, "He now starts six months of chemo." I put my arms around them and prayed for them. Jace's smile reminded me, "When you see someone without a smile, give them yours."

The next day Jace told his mom, he hoped to see me so he could give me this bracelet, "Have faith like Jace."



50/50 Chance

When I asked the radiologist what percent of the cancer they could eradicate (because sarcoma travels fast), she calmly said, "50/50."



My mind instantly thought, "With God, it's a win/win, whatever the outcome!" So, in everything we give thanks to God, for this is His will for us (1 Thess 5:18). He looks at the big picture of our lives and His plan is 100% for our good!

Speed Bump

So far this cancer journey has only been a speed bump, not a brick wall. After the treatment every morning comes a full day of serving people in the office or around the world through WhatsApp and Zoom.

In a day, I may be speaking with a medical doctor in Venezuela struggling with the childhood abuse from his father or with a pastor and wife in Argentina whose 16-year-old daughter died in a car accident or with another couple in Argentina whose 14-year-old son just took his life. Cancer has not stopped us from sharing emotional and spiritual help with our brothers and sisters. Yes, it is true that "by His wounds we are healed" and by our wounds others are healed (Is. 53:5; 1 Cor. 4:3,4).



What's Ahead?

The doctors said we should be "good to go" for the international travel in October and November. We are compiling possible trainings for 2026, Lord willing.
